### Information for nominators and nominees for the Carruth McGehee Award for Excellent Research by a Junior Faculty Member

## Eligibility

Associate professors in the departments of Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Geology & Geophysics, and Physics & Astronomy are eligible for this award. The nomination should be based on a specific work, which may be a paper, a small and coherent collection of results, or a book.

# Award Amount

\$2,000

### Nominators

Nominators must be LSU tenured faculty members and should prepare the package for a nominee. Self-nominations are not allowed. The nominator may be from a department other than Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Geology & Geophysics, or Physics & Astronomy, but should be a tenured LSU faculty member.

### **Nomination Packet Requirements**

A packet should not include (and a candidate should not be requested to supply) a research statement, a teaching statement, or teaching reviews.

The packet should contain:

- 1. Three expert letters that address the specific work for which the candidate is nominated.
  - At least one letter must be from an outside expert.
  - At least one letter must be from a tenured LSU faculty member (presumably from the nominator). This letter should include a short and clear characterization of the nominated work and the paper(s) or book that is the basis of the nomination.
- 2. A paragraph description of each letter writer's qualifications.
- 3. The candidate's C.V.
- 4. Copies of the work.
- 5. Supplemental material that addresses the nominated work may be included, e.g., grant reviews of an application to perform the specific nominated work or reviews of the nominated paper(s) or book.

### Deadline

Nominators should inform Dr. Oliver Dasbach, committee chair, by email (<u>odasbach@lsu.edu</u>) of their intention to nominate a candidate by February 1st, 2025. Complete packets are due March 1st, 2025.

### Selection

The Carruth McGehee Award committee makes the final selection of the recipient.

#### Sample email to request a support letter for a nomination.

Below is a sample email that may be used to solicit an expert letter. The email must make clear which work is nominated.
